Interview

You will be asked to meet with the Stewardship Coordinator and Chairperson to review your application and interest in the program. Early applicants will be interviewed on **March 18** all other applicants will be interviewed on **April 15** Applicants will be notified as soon as possible of their acceptance.

The Washington Native Plant Stewardship Program in South Seattle is partnering with the City of Seattle to educate committed volunteers to help restore natural areas and parks within Seattle.

The 10-week training will be held on Fridays from April 29 through July 9th. (No class May 27th or July 1st). There will also be four Saturday classes. The training is taught by top professionals on various topics such as native plants, habitat restoration and north-west ecology. In exchange for this free training, stewards will commit to 100 hours of volunteer service implementing the skills learned in these classes on local restoration projects. Class will be at Camp Long and Pritchard Beach.
